Based on the October 1, 2005 enrollment report, there are 463 students enrolled at Garfield Elementary with an ethnic composition of:

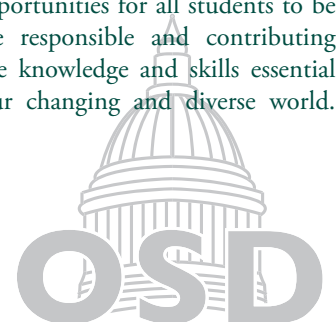

Our School Improvement Plan:

GOAL 1: READING

- Increase the percentage of students meeting standard on the Grade 3 Reading WASL from 70.8% in 2006 to 74.5% in 2007.
- Increase the percentage of students meeting standard on the Grade 4 Reading WASL from 87.0% in 2006 to 88.6% in 2007.
- Increase the percentage of students meeting standard on the Grade 5 Reading WASL from 86.8% in 2006 to 88.5% in 2007.

GOAL 2: WRITING

- Increase the percentage of students meeting standard on the Grade 4 Writing WASL from 54.3% in 2006 to 60.3% in 2007.

GOAL 3: MATH

- Increase the percentage of students meeting standard on the Grade 3 Math WASL from 73.8% in 2006 to 77.1% in 2007.
- Increase the percentage of students meeting standard on the Grade 4 Math WASL from 75.7% in 2006 to 78.7% in 2007.
- Increase the percentage of students meeting standard on the Grade 5 Math WASL from 62.3 in 2006 to 67.0% in 2007.

GOAL 4: SCIENCE

- Increase the percentage of students meeting standard on the Grade 5 Science WASL from 36.2% in 2006 to 44.2% in 2007.
