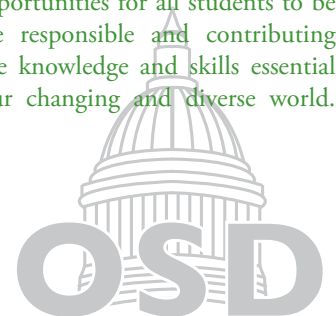

Our School Improvement Plan

▶ GOAL 1: READING -

- ▶ Increase the percentage of students meeting standard on the Grade 3 Reading WASL from 81.9% in 2008 to 84.0% in 2009.
- ▶ Increase the percentage of students meeting standard on the Grade 4 Reading WASL from 74.1% in 2008 to 84.0% in 2009.
- ▶ Increase the percentage of students meeting standard on the Grade 5 Reading WASL from 85.0% in 2008 to 86.0% in 2009.

- ▶ **GOAL 2: WRITING** - Increase the percentage of students meeting standard on the Grade 4 Writing WASL from 72.4% in 2008 to 73.4% in 2009.

▶ GOAL 3: MATH -

- ▶ Increase the percentage of students meeting standard on the Grade 3 Math WASL from 75.0 % in 2008 to 76.0% in 2009.
- ▶ Increase the percentage of students meeting standard on the Grade 4 Math WASL from 60.3% in 2008 to 73.0% in 2009.
- ▶ Increase the percentage of students meeting standard on the Grade 5 Math WASL from 67.2% in 2008 to 73.0% in 2009.

- ▶ **GOAL 4: SCIENCE** - Increase the percentage of students meeting standard on the Grade 5 Science WASL from 51.7% in 2008 to 52.7% in 2009.
